India is going through a period of accelerated change but the weaker are often left behind. Only about 1% of the total budgeted income is spent on health care nationally. However, Tamil Nadu is an exception

and health facilities are improving for the poor.

As priorities change, we have to be ready to respond as we are only here 'to do His will' which, in my case, seems to be a great deal more hard work!

## Silence to Hearing to Speech

The Hearing Project, championed from the UK by Dianne Ward, has gone from strength to strength. More hearing aids have been funded by individual supporters and by the Hear the World Foundation (HWF) - the charitable arm of Phonak.

HWF have also sent volunteer audiologists led by Crystal Variava (Director of Audiology & Education India) and Nicolas Beck (Head of HWF Switzerland) to help with fitting and training the staff further. All the school staff have been taught how to manage the hearing aids on a day to day basis and 4 have been given extra training in basic audiology.

Nico says: "We find the project at the Rangammal School to be one of our showcases." Kiran was "...moved by the dedication of the whole team of Rangammal School and by the plight of these kids...I am thankful to God for whatever he has given me."
